Japan Day with Japan Connect and DAIWA

At this session, which is aimed at non-Japanese students, we will hear from two speakers about their experiences in Japan.

- 1) Eluned completed an MA in Creative Writing at UEA in 2012 and then went to Japan on a DAIWA scholarship for two years. Eluned went to Japan with no knowledge of the language and passed Level N2 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test and did her work placement at the Japanese Literature Publishing and Promotion Centre and at the Representative Office of the Welsh Government in Japan. She will speak about the DAIWA programme and the opportunities it offers, including language training, an extended homestay and the 6 month work placement.
- 2) Anna is a JET programme alumna and has had a varied Japan related career since then. She is now the founder of Japan Connect Ltd and the Japan/Korea Trade specialist for UK Trade





and Industry. In her spare time she is the Careers and Networking coordinator for the JET programme and so will offer some useful insights for those wanting to pursue a Japan related career.


