

JSPS London call of the JSPS Pre/Postdoctoral Fellowship for Research in Japan (Short-term) - Notes for Referees

1. Eligible Referees:

- Referees should be leading international authorities in their chosen field of research.
- The referees should normally and where possible be UK based.
- The applicant's proposed host researcher is not eligible to act as a referee.
- At least one reference for PhD students must be provided by their supervisor.

2. Procedure:

- · Reference forms should be typed.
- Reference forms for Pre-doctoral applicants <u>must</u> include a statement of the month
 and year the student is expected to submit their final thesis, have their viva and finally
 when they can be conferred with their PhD. This timeline is especially required if the
 PhD completion time on the acquisition status letter issued by the applicant's university
 differs.
- All opinions expressed are treated with complete confidentiality.
- The referee should use the prescribed JSPS London reference form and complete and send it to JSPS London by e mail at **short-termaward@jsps.org**.
